From the Pastor's Desk

HAVE YOU GROWN IN YOUR FAITH?

Has anyone ever asked you that question? It's a popular question, and it's a good question - especially when we ask it of ourselves. It can mean a number of different things though. Does it mean that the faith you first learned has gotten stronger? Does it mean that the faith you first learned has changed over time? I think they are both important ways to examine our faith as we grow older. Some parts shouldn't change, but some parts should.

I can think of so many ways my understanding of who God is (Jesus and Holy Spirit too), what God wants, who we are made to be, what does it mean to be a follower of Jesus, etc. have changed have grown. Almost always, in one way or another, the growth of my christian faith and understanding has come through interactions with others. Usually interactions with fellow believers, but not always. Sometimes it's through conversation, sometimes through reading and study, sometimes other ways. The most growth, I am sure, has not come through people who think like I do, but through people who don't think like I do. Trying to understand what and how they really think, not assuming I know or that they think the way I do, is the first step. Asking questions about why they might think differently, about where they are "coming from," is the next. But we also have to consider where we are "coming from" and how that colors our opinions. We should ask ourselves "are they right, and my direction of thinking needs to change?" An affirmative answer is a hard one for us to accept. It's probably better for us to reserve our final judgement and give

ourselves some time first. It's often been a way I've found that God leads me to grow in ways that I never would have thought possible. When I think back over the years, that has happened to me a lot.

A final thing that is important for us to ask ourselves is, "Who is responsible for growing my faith?" The answer, of course, is always ourselves. (cont'd on pg. 2)


May we all, in conversation, speak the truth and listen well.
