"Love your neighbor as yourself;" we all know that Jesus said it. Jesus didn't come up with it. It goes all the way back to Leviticus. In Mark chapter 28 (in Matthew and Luke as well) we find out that one of the scribes knew it as well and agreed with Jesus that the two most important things for people to do were to love God with all our heart and love our neighbor as ourselves. "There is no other commandment greater than these," said Jesus. In John's gospel Jesus issues it as his "new commandment" to his followers. James calls it the "Royal Law." Paul repeats it many times. The necessity of loving others is all over the New Testament. Colossians says this: "And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony."

Love sure sounds powerful!

But love isn't easy. You remember what I Corinthians says: Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things."

Still, even though it will be difficult, as far as the Bible is concerned, more than anything else, love should be our identity.

In the end there are only three things, "faith, hope, and love remain, these three, and the greatest of these is love."

That's all I have to say this month...



10 Reflections from Our Daily Bread.

Integrity

In 1524, Martin Luther observed, "Among themselves the merchants have a common rule which is their chief maxim...l care nothing about my neighbor; so long as I have my profit and satisfy my greed." More than two hundred years later, John Woolman, from Mount Holly, New Jersey, let his commitment to Jesus influence his tailor shop dealings. Out of support for the freeing of slaves, he refused to purchase any cotton or dye supplies from companies who used their forced labor. With a clear conscience, he loved his neighbor and lived according to integrity and sincerity in all his dealings.

The apostle Paul strived to live out "God-given holiness and sincerity" (2 Corinthians 1:12). When some in Corinth tried to undermine his authority as an apostle for Jesus, he defended his conduct among them. He wrote that his words and actions could withstand the closest scrutiny (v.13). He also showed that he was dependent on God's power and grace for effectiveness, not his own (v.12). In short, Paul's faith in Christ permeated all h is dealings.

As we live as ambassadors for Jesus, may we be careful to let the good news ring out in all our dealings—family business, and more. When by God's power and grace we reveal His love to others, we honor Him and love our neighbors well.

How are the words and actions a representation of your faith in Jesus? As a believer in Him, why are integrity and sincerity vital in your dealings with others?

Dear God, help me to serve others with such a clear conscience that my love for them is evident.




